



## Kindergarten and Grade 1

In the last month we had a couple engaging guest speakers. Marne from the **1854 Treaty Outreach** visited all the Ojibwe classes. She read a story about the Great Flood and showed the students fur pelts from many different animals. She also included the Ojibwe names for the animal pelts. The students enjoyed exploring and touching all the different animals and their fur!

In addition, we had traditional Ojibwe storytelling with Billy Blackwell. Billy had each student create a piece of art that depicted the story he told. The kids thought that was cool!

## Grades 2 and 3

Grades 2 and 3 has had quite the month. In addition to being language focused we had a film crew from Germany visit and observe our class. The students made us proud speaking Ojibwemowin.

It was exciting for the kids to get to know the crew and learn a few words of Anishinaabemowin! The film crew sang us a song in the German language. The students loved that.

Ms Jeana's K-1 News

We have done a lot of plant activities this month. Tess came in and taught us about the 13° Ojibwe moon. She taught them about different bean sprouts and at the end, they all tried the different sprouts. They had pea sprouts, mung bean sprouts, rodish sprouts, and green bean sprouts. We made mini greenhouses using augs and the kids planted bean sprouts. They will take care of them and observe the plant growth. We also went to the winter greenhouse: the kids observed the bugs on the plants. They also picked lettuce. The lettuce was brought back to school for lunch. In class we are growing an amaryllis plant. Each day at morning meeting we measure to see how tall it is getting. They were so excited when the flower bloomed. After the plant went through its life cycle, we cut off the bulbs and placed them in a cod dry place. After 5 weeks we are going to try and grow more amaryllis plants. It was a fun month full of plant activities.
