The students have been working hard on their play and their songs for the Christmas program. We had the opportunity to work in the winter greenhouse. The students got to learn about different plants and then planted the seeds. We will revisit the greenhouse to see how our plants are doing. In science we did a snow and icicle experiment. First, we got a jar of snow and let it melt. The students had to predict how much water would come from the jar of snow. They learned there is more air than water in snow. We did the same experiment with icicles. They also learned that snow and icicles are dirty. We go on our wilderness Wednesday walks and Mrs. Clearwater wrote a grant to get us safety vests to wear while walking on the side of the road. Thank you, Mrs. Clearwater! News from Ms. Clearwater's Second and Third Grade:

Our class enjoyed planting in the Winter Garden. Miigwich to Mr. Andrew and Ms. Emily who provided the great opportunity for us to plant carrots, spinach and tomatoes! It was very warm in the Winter Greenhouse with a temperature over 80 degrees. On our Nature Walk we harvested a Christmas tree for our Classroom and Christmas Program. It was fun to cut it down, we are doing an evergreen experiment with it, then will utilize it as a bird feeder outside our classroom window. We learned how polar animals stay warm in the winter. The science behind staying on top of the snow and ice for animals and people. The Aurora Borealis was a fun lesson, we were surprised to see how the sun plays a major role in those beautiful lights that dance in the night sky! We have been working on using our reading and math skills to make Christmas projects. In math we each created a long chain to measure in centimeters and in inches. We then made a chart and determined the total length of our chain! Making snow people out of recycled bottles and filling them with marshmallows made a nice family gift for those hot chocolate days!
