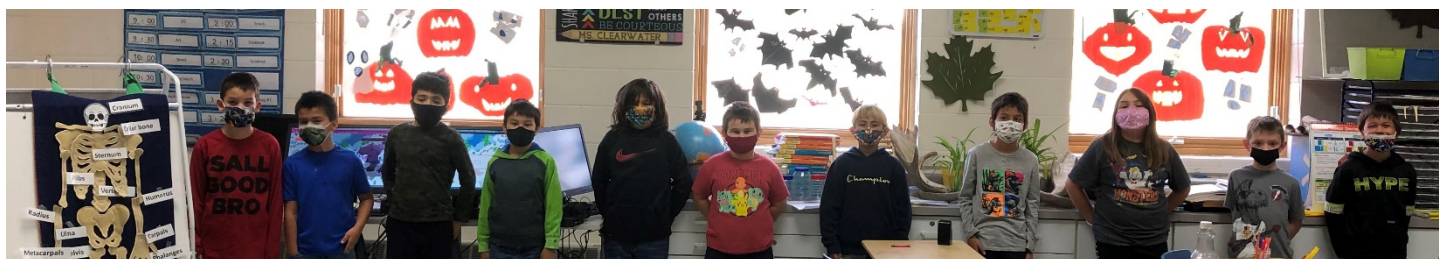
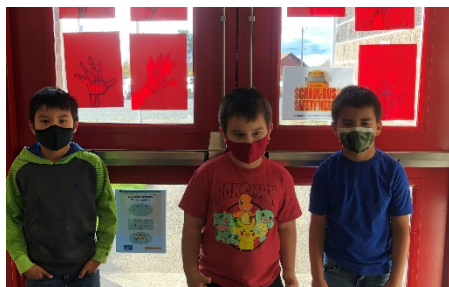

## News from Ms. Clearwater's Second and Third Grade Class

Our class is learning about the bones in our body! Our skeletons are amazing. We have 206 bones in our body. We did an art project and made an x-ray of the bones in our hands. We are studying bats too. Did you know that the bats belong to the order of Chiroptera which means "hand wing" in ancient Greek? The bones in the bat wings are similar to the bones that make up the human hands!

On Wednesdays we are enjoying educational games. Putting together a puzzle of the world and "The Allowance Game" are two of our favorites. On Friday we are learning Yoga with Ms. Carly and we are learning Drum with Mr. Tanner on Mondays. We learn about symmetry in making pumpkins, bats and ghosts.
